PITTSBURG – Wayland G. Osgood, of Pittsburg, N.H., passed away unexpectedly at his home on Tuesday, January 28, 2025, five days shy of his 89th birthday. He was born on February 2, 1936, in Sutton, Vt., a son to the late Guy William Osgood and Harriet Agnes Wilcox.
