



William C Clogston

January 19, 1929 - February 4, 2022

HURLEY, N.Y. – William ‘Bill’ C. Clogston, 93, of Hurley, N.Y., passed away on Friday, Feb. 4, 2022.

He was born in Pittsburg on Jan. 19, 1929, a son to the late Paul and Alta M. (Wheeler) Clogston. He was raised and educated in Pittsburg.

In 1946, Bill went to work for the Punkett & Webster Saw Mill in Pittsburg and worked there until 1949. He later worked for Miller Construction in Windsor, Vt., until he entered the U.S. Army in 1951. He served during the Korean conflict and was honorably discharged in 1953. After his military service, he went to work on the Littleton Dam in Littleton, N.H., helped to build the Massachusetts Turnpike, the Niagra Falls Power Project, the Chesapeake Bay Bridge and Tunnel, and also Interstate 91 in Massachusetts and Vermont. In 1965, he moved to Kingston, N.Y., and went to work for Rock Construction for 13 years. In 1978, he began working for Constanzi Crane of Kingston as a crane operator, from which he semi-retired in 1994.

Bill was a member of the VFW in Hurley, N.Y., and the Hurley Lions Club. He was an avid hunter and fisherman, and a talented amateur photographer.

He is survived by his wife, Mary Ellen (Murphy) Clogston; and a son, Marc Clogston. Bill is predeceased by his daughter, Sherry Lynn Gromoll in 1998;

and two sisters, Pauline Oaks and Ernestine Scott.

There are no public calling hours scheduled. A graveside interment service, with military honors, will be held at a later date in 2022 in the Pittsburg Hollow Cemetery in Pittsburg, N.H., of which notice will be given.
